4.2 Bingo Cards and Sales
 Added the ability to use Braille cards for more flexibility to provide service to patrons.
 Amended paper card requirements for games with pre-determined, set numbers and/or wild numbers
 a. requiring folded and sealed bingo cards if games have pre-determined or set numbers; and
 requiring folded cards for games where "wild numbers" are determined at the event level.
 Added the ability to use credit cards for bingo card sales and/or admission to a bingo event.
• Removed the maximum of bingo card types that can be sold per seller. Licensee will decide how many types of cards can be sold per seller.
4.3 Prizes
• Amended the cash and non-cash prize requirements for clarity, to include "seeded funds" and donated non-cash prizes.
• Added "Seeding" process for use of gaming and non-gaming funds for regular and special games as well as for progressive contributions. Non-gaming funds used cannot be revoked.
• Amended policy on minimum and/or guaranteed progressive jackpot contributions using seeding from either event revenue and/or non-gaming funds.
• Added information on progressive jackpot requirements for games and/or schemes to provide clarity. This will streamline the requirements for licensees to create effective rules of play for progressive game and/or schemes for their bingo program(s).
Added details on fire ball progressive jackpots for clarity.
 Added the ability to have capped progressive jackpots and the rules of play requirements. This will provide more options for the licensee when offering games and/or schemes with progressive jackpots.
Updated and clarified the requirement for verification unit use.
 Amended list of expenses for better flow and clarity. Streamlined financial control system requirements for bingo event cash and inventory management controls. All cash and inventory transactions are required to be recorded, verified and initialed between the volunteer and/or paid staff. Requirement added for event financial/inventory controls forms to be completed as transactions occur, in real time.
