

Groups may use gaming proceeds for educational bursaries or scholarships for post-secondary study at Alberta government approved provincial, national, or international universities, public colleges, or technical institutes in accordance with the Charitable Gaming Policies Handbook (CGPH) 5.5.

With prior approval, the group may:

- Establish its own bursary or scholarship program
- Establish a bursary or scholarship program in the name of the group and have it administered by a post-secondary educational institution
- Donate gaming proceeds directly to an eligible post-secondary educational institution for existing bursary or scholarship programs in accordance with CGPH Donations 5.8 and 5.9.

The selection process for awarding bursaries or scholarships must include the following:

- Eligibility criteria
- Composition of the decision-making body responsible for reviewing the applications
- Number and value of the bursaries and scholarships awarded

The bursaries or scholarships must be widely publicized and made available to all qualified individuals, not limited to family, friends, or members of the licensed group, or decision-making body that selects the recipients.

Prior to awarding the bursary or scholarship, the group must confirm the recipient:

- Meets the eligibility criteria for receiving the bursary or scholarship
- Will be attending the post-secondary institution (e.g., acceptance letter)

The group may make payment directly to the post-secondary educational institution for tuition or related costs on behalf of the recipient or directly to the recipient with proof of payment (e.g., tuition receipt).
